The UCLA Program in Global Health is looking for alumni with professional expertise in reproductive health, food and nutrition, health and human rights, migrant health, HIV/AIDS, harm reduction, emerging infectious diseases and policy strategies to help address global health challenges. As leaders in this arena, alumni can volunteer to give a Global Health Selective lecture, participate in Global Health Awareness Week and/or serve as a mentor.

Global Health Selective

Approximately 40 students participate in the Global Health Selective course during the fall of their first or second year of medical school. The goal of this selective is to gain an understanding of the multidisciplinary nature of global health issues and the complex interplay of biological, social, cultural, environmental, economic and political factors. Students explore a specific global health issue of their choice through focused case studies.

Global Health Awareness Week

This annual student-run initiative raises the awareness of the challenges faced in addressing health inequity around the world, from least developed countries to the G20, in the UCLA Health Sciences community. It includes talks by influential leaders in the field, community service activities, and advocacy training. The goal is to inspire individuals to support efforts to reduce health inequities, whether by supporting good health policies or by becoming global health professionals.
